The main short-term objective is to launch joint calls, as a result of collaboration between different funding programs and the EIT Health.



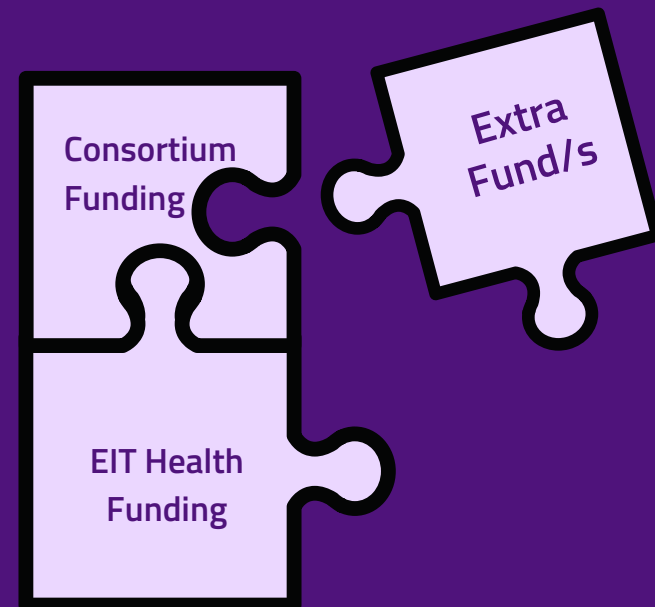
1/3 Principle: what do we really mean by this?

As we move into our second seven-year cycle of EIT funding and support, we want to look to the future and start thinking beyond 2025, achieve our goal of becoming the health innovation platform for the EU and achieve the great ambition of implementing synergies following the need to align European resources.

We can only achieve this together and the 1/3 principle is the first step in us attaining this goal, where we want to incentivise Partners to bring additional funding. Whilst this is not a mandatory requirement, those applications that can evidence this, will receive up to one extra point in the phase of the final evaluation of the proposal.

EIT Health will support you in achieving this goal and the creation of high-impact synergies is the starting point.

1/3 Principle: 3 Funding Sources



EIT Health Funding

Funding from EIT Health, maximum 70%

Consortium Funding **mandatory*

Funding from public and private partners, minimum 30%

Extra Fund/s **desired, not mandatory*

Funding from EU funds, National/Regional funds, Private funds

Relevant information to keep in mind

- Incorporating extra fund/s is not mandatory, it is desired.
- Incorporating extra funds will not be evaluated at short proposal stage: only at final proposal phase.
- To be reviewed, analyzed and built during the support program phase, with the support of EIT Health team.
- Description of implementation to be detailed at final proposal submission phase.
- Please contact your hub for further information.

Extra point

Adding extra fund/s gives an extra point in the final evaluation (not at short proposal phase):





Rules

Same Activity Fund	Complementary Activity Fund
<p>Fund/s are incorporated for the development of the same activities submitted in the proposal.</p>	<p>Fund/s are incorporated for the development of complementary activities to those submitted in the proposal.</p>
<p>Fund/s will be cataloged as extra co-funding in the <u>EFA</u> (EIT Funded Activity). <i>*Please have into account that the fund/s for same activities can not be European funds: double co-funding is not allowed.</i></p>	<p>All type of funds are in principle allowed and will be cataloged as <u>NEFA</u>. (Non EIT Funded Activity) <i>*See Call Document ANNEX 13.</i></p>
<p>Follows regular EIT Health Progress and Cost Reporting.</p>	<p>Follows regular EIT Health Progress Reporting. Cost Reporting is driven by the funding body.</p>



Example *of bringing extra fund/s*

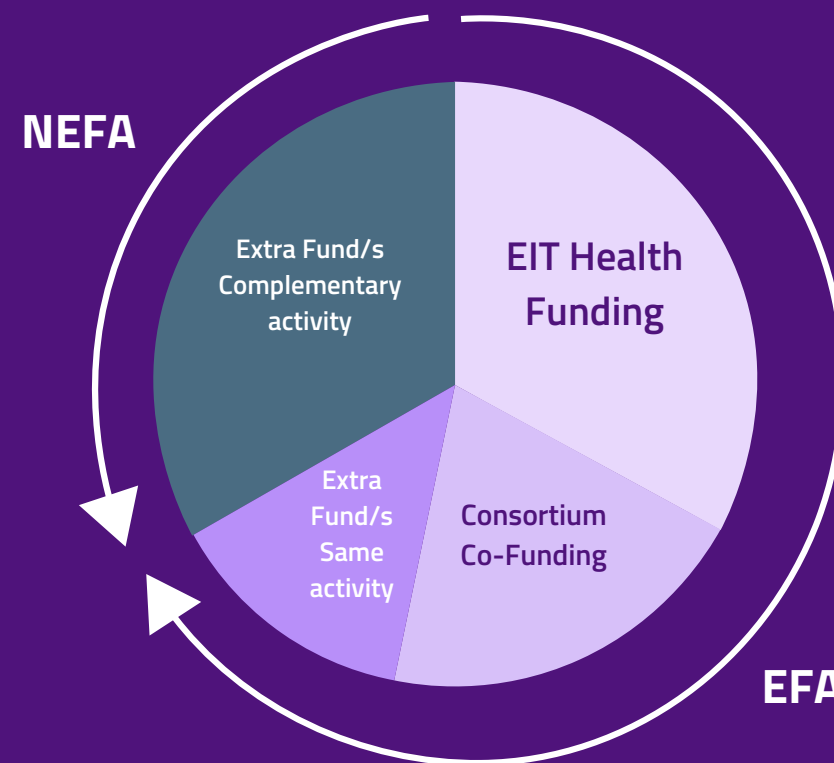
Here is an example of two synergies which contribute to the project proposal with extra funding.

Synergy 1: extra funding for the same activity, coming for example from a national program to which partners have applied or intend to apply.

Synergy 2: extra funding for complementary activities to those described in the proposal, coming for example from a European call to which partners have applied or intend to apply.

The result is a final proposal submitted to EIT Health based in our rule of 70max./30min. applying for the next 3 years -2023, 2025, where synergies created with other programs increase our impact.
